Analysis:

Classes of data are collected and studies conducted to discern patterns and formulate principles that might guide future action

Case study:

The background, development, current conditions and environmental interactions of one or more individuals, groups, communities, businesses or institutions is observed, recorded and analyzed for stages of patterns in relation to internal and external influences.

Comparison:

Two or more existing situations are studied to determine their similarities and differences.

Correlation-prediction:

Statistically significant correlation coefficients between and among a number of factors are sought and interpreted.

Evaluation:

Research to determine whether a program or project followed the prescribed procedures and achieved the stated outcomes.

Design-demonstration:

New systems or programs are constructed, tested and evaluated

Experiment

One or more variables are manipulated and the results analyzed.

Survey-questionnaire:

Behaviors, beliefs and observations of specific groups are identified, reported and interpreted.

Status

A representative or selected sample of one or more phenomena is examined to determine its special characteristics.

Theory construction

An attempt to find or describe principles that explain how things work the way they do.

Trend analysis

Predicting or forecasting the future direction of events.
